

**Job Posting –Cycling Educator (On-Call)

CultureLink is seeking to hire up to six On-Call Cycling Educators for its Bike to School Project and Bike Host programs, to deliver cycling education programs between April 2, 2018 and March 31, 2019 on an occasional basis. Programs will teach road safety, cycling skills and basic bike maintenance. The Cycling Educators report to the Assistant Manager, Sustainable Communities. **CultureLink works within an anti-oppression framework and is committed to equity.**

CultureLink is collaborating with Cycle Toronto for selection and training for this position.

Responsibilities:

- Present cycling education programs to elementary and secondary school students during and after school hours (programs include assemblies, workshops in the classroom, schoolyard skills activities, and rides off school property in some cases), and in community venues
- Prepare and transport presentation materials, supplies, and tools to each program
- Model responsible cycling by traveling by bicycle to program delivery sites, where possible
- Complete a report following each program, documenting positive and negative outcomes, participation, weather conditions, etc.; complete incident reports in the event of issues of concern
- Collect exit surveys
- Offer constructive feedback on the program
- Other duties as assigned by supervisor

Required qualifications:

- Strong presentation skills
- Proven ability to engage children and youth in an institutional setting
- Strong cycling skills, including cycling in traffic outside of downtown
- Punctuality and reliability
- Ability to work cooperatively as part of a team
- Commitment to anti-racism and combating other forms of discrimination
- Readiness to commit to a regular schedule throughout the period of employment
- Satisfactory Vulnerable Sector Screening (police check), original copy
- Emergency First Aid / CPR certification *
- CAN-BIKE Instructor or CAN-BIKE Level 4 (formerly “CAN-BIKE 2”) certification *

* A CAN-BIKE Level 4 course (12-hour commitment) and Emergency First Aid / CPR course (8-hour commitment) will be provided at no charge to otherwise successful candidates prior to the beginning of work.

Assets

- Experience with teaching road safety and cycling skills
- Track record of engagement with Toronto’s cycling community
- Strong skills in bicycle maintenance and repair
