CultureLink is seeking a long-term project worker to support a new Bicycle Hub in northwest Toronto, from July 3, 2018 to March 31, 2019, with possibility of extension. Reporting to the Assistant Manager, Sustainable Communities, and in collaboration with program partners including the City of Toronto Tower Renewal program and Toronto Community Housing, the youth worker will recruit and engage 50 youth in bicycle repair and maintenance, while fostering a practice of reuse and recycling in the community. **CultureLink works within an anti-oppression framework and is committed to equity.**

Responsibilities

- Recruit 50 youth participants for training programs
- Support the Program Worker to plan, prepare and deliver bike mechanics training activities for participants
- Monitor attendance of youth participants, and evaluate their involvement in the program
- With the Program worker, deliver workshops on-site or in the community
- With the Program worker, support DIY drop-in activities
- Participate in the program's evaluation activities and provide insightful and constructive inputs for program development
- Collaborate with team members and other CultureLink teams
- Other duties as assigned by supervisor.

Qualifications

- Proven skills in recruiting and facilitating activities with youth
- Intermediate skills and experience in bicycle maintenance
- Skills and experience cycling in traffic
- Degree or diploma in Social Services, Social Sciences or related field with a minimum of 1 year experience working with newcomer/racialized children and youth; or a combination of equivalent education and experience
- Solid knowledge and experience working within an Anti-Opressive framework and understanding of anti-racism and anti-discrimination practice
- Excellent cross-cultural communication
- Satisfactory Vulnerable Sector Screening (police check).

Assets

- Experience with teaching road safety, cycling skills and bicycle mechanics
- Track record of engagement with Toronto's cycling community
- Strong familiarity with neighbourhoods in northwest Toronto (Black Creek, North Etobicoke)
- CAN-BIKE training; First aid training; Food safety training
- Proficiency in Word, Excel, Outlook, and social media tools
